

Alun Be is an artist who strives to portray African modernity. Born Alioune Ba in 1981 in Dakar, Senegal, Be credits the development of his oeuvre largely to his French, American, and West African upbringing. Be's parents did not believe art was a stable career, pushing him to pursue an M.A. in Architecture. After two years as an architect in Senegal, a move to Denmark sparked his love for photography. Since then, Be has exhibited at the Milan Universal Exposition(2015), the Dakar Biennale (2018), the Museum of Contemporary Photography of Chicago (2018), and others, and spoken at TEDxNapoli and TEDxWanChai Salon. His photography series deal largely with intergenerationality, female empowerment, and technology.

Alun [be] is an artist whose captivating images distinguish themselves through profound expression in high contrast. Born in Dakar, Senegal, his diverse approach has carved a niche suspended between his upbringing in France, the United States, and West Africa. Alun's art form is constantly evolving through personal projects focused on the human condition in public spaces, incited by his studies in San Francisco where he received his M.A. in Architecture



About Clive Mukucha

Clive Mukucha is a mid-career Zimbabwean artist whose body of art works is illustrative of his resourceful ingenuity. He is an artist who makes use of every object he collects to create art. He is able to turn mundane objects of our consumerist society into compelling works of art – alive to the riches of form, shape and texture in art, in discarded consumer packaging containers and blessed with a hunters-gatherers' instinct to stumble upon objects.

"Mukucha was trained at the BAT Workshop School in Mbare. Some of his acrylic on paper works with their characteristic sculptural broad tactile strokes and mixed-media found object sculpture can be found at the National Gallery of Zimbabwe and various other art centres in Harare," writes academic and fellow artist Dr Tony Monda.

He will be exhibiting and participating in workshops alongside fellow Zimbabwean artists from the Zimbabwe Assemblage Collective (ZAC) for the Full Circle Art Africa programme in Hong Kong.





About **Ousmane Mbaye**

Ousmane Mbaye, born on November 26, 1975 in Dakar, is a Senegalese designer and decorator. A former refrigeration technician – a profession he has held for 17 years – he took advantage of this know-how (or "savoir fer", according to him) to create contemporary furniture from recycled materials (drum lids). Using galvanized metal water pipes, he nourishes a real passion for metal and likes starting from the raw material. By folding the metal according to his inspiration, he creates and assemble the material to produce a table, a tray or a lamp.

Ousmane Mbaye is recognized today in Senegal and much further afield as an essential representative of the creative vivacity of his generation.
